Delphi Consensus on ALF: Practice Guidelines

At the 11th CLBS Symposium, one of the highlights will be a multidisciplinary meeting on “**Best Clinical Practices for Acute Liver Failure**”. This session, framed within the symposium’s overarching theme of “**Optimising The Perioperative Period**” presents a forward-looking perspective on addressing a vital aspect that poses challenges despite advances in medical science. This will also be very relevant to current period where there has been a surge in admissions for Acute Liver failure (ALF). ALF covers all conditions that cause a rapid deterioration from Liver injury to failure and management strategies vary depending on institutional and personal preferences. These differences lead to erratic and delayed decision making contributing to morbidity and mortality and more importantly, it often leaves the relatives quite confused. Lack of standardized guidelines, poor predictive models, differences in aetiologies between the west and the east, and the dynamic nature of this entity proclaim the need for robust guidelines that clinicians can rely upon. In light of this, a panel of multidisciplinary experts has come together to develop a consensus through the Delphi method, which combines anonymous feedback and iterative rounds of discussion to achieve an agreement on best practices. This will ensure that the resulting guidelines are not only be evidence-based but also reflect the practical experiences of clinicians working in various settings. The consensus will emphasise several key principles intended to shape the future management of Acute Liver failure. This will include recommendations for preoperative assessment, management strategies, assessment of dynamic parameters, listing for transplant, current role of plasmapheresis and filters in the management of these patients. Furthermore, the consensus will outline protocols for peri-operative management, including the use of non-invasive monitoring of intra-cranial pressure, decision making for transplant and guidelines for the post-operative management in patients that have gone through a transplant. The guidelines will stress the importance of multidisciplinary teamwork, involving hepatologists, transplant surgeons and intensivists, to ensure comprehensive care for these patients. The Consensus meet, scheduled on the **21st September, 2025**, is poised to be a transformative moment at the **11th CLBS Symposium**. By fostering a collaborative environment focused on optimising the care for these patients, this initiative aims to enhance patient care and set a new standard for clinical practice. The symposium promises to be a cornerstone event, paving the way for continuous improvement and innovation in overcoming the complex challenges associated with managing ALF.
